

Welsh dance company to perform at DanceLive

AN ACCLAIMED Welsh Dance Company is to perform in Aberdeen for the first time as part of the DanceLive festival.

Ffin Dance will be performing Synapsequence and Five Dances at The Lemon Tree Studio on Tuesday, October 23 at 7pm.

Artistic director and founder of Ffin Dance, Sue Lewis said: "We have been hoping to bring our work to Scotland for a while and were delighted when festival director Andy Howitt invited us to Aberdeen to perform at DanceLive 2012.

"It's our first visit to Aberdeen and we're hoping to make some great new links."

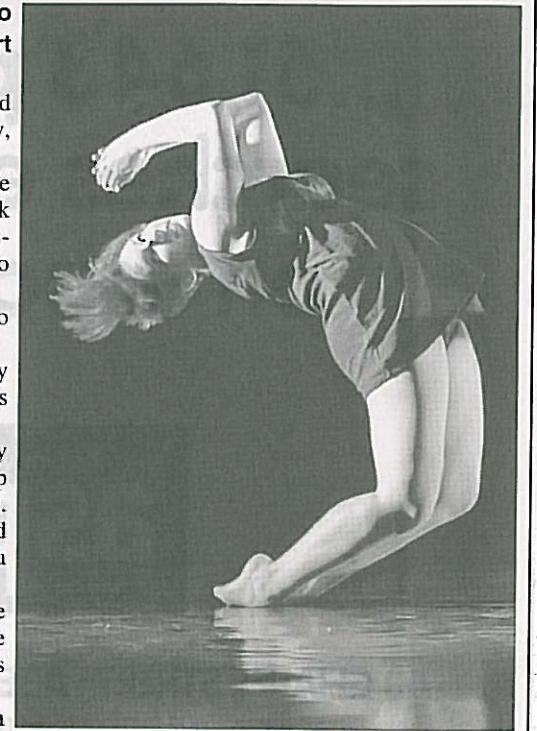
Synapsequence was choreographed by Gary Lambert, to music by Ronen Kozokaro, and has movement as the starting point of exploration.

A specially commissioned score, three dancers and some swish costumes by Steve Denton, make for a great piece of entertainment.
